Inter-State Fair and Rodeo in Coffeyville

The Inter-State Fair and Rodeo is August 10-16 Entry forms for the livestock are due July 15, 2024 to the Coffeyville Chamber and is accessible at https://fairandrodeo.com/livestock-show/entry-forms-fees. Fees are due with the entry forms.

KJLS Entries

Entries for the Kansas Junior Livestock Show are due by August 15. We will be receiving entry forms and booklets later in July about the Kansas Junior Livestock Show. Information can also be found at https://www.kjls.net/

Kansas State Fair

Market Livestock and breeding animal entries are to be postmarked by July 15. Late entries will be accepted until July 25 with a \$10 per head late fee. Each exhibitor must complete the request for Taxpayer Identification Number and Certification form to receive premiums earned. Entry forms and taxpayer identification forms are available at the Extension Office or on-line at http://www.kansasstatefair.com/p/competitions. Entry forms require an Extension Agent's signature. Please do not wait until the last minute to get a signature. The Agents are not in the Office every day. Please call and make arrangements ahead of time.

4-Hers that would like to serve as a volunteer at the Kansas State Fair, are encouraged to do so. For more information about this, contact your Extension Office.

"Fair Entry" is LIVE

Superintendent Responsibilities

Junior superintendents work with your adult superintendents or Jenny to figure out where you are needed and what you are supposed to be doing.

Superintendent Responsibilities (Livestock)

- Gather ribbons and plaques before show
- Help with weigh in
- Break classes
- Line up each class
- Serve as ring help
- Announce show
- Handout ribbons
- Record results
- Return results to extension staff

Superintendent Responsibilities (Non-Livestock)

- Make sure you have paper, pencil, ribbons, and superintendent's book.
- Take entries.
- Put entries on table by entry number.
- Assist the judge during judging.
- Write down placing's in superintendent's book
- Distribute ribbons.
- Display items according to category.
- Return superintendent's book to extension staff
- Make sure items are not disturbed.
- Assist with release of items.

Premium Sale Requirements

It is that time of year to start thinking about the fair. It is required that youth wishing to sell animals in the Premium Sale at the fair next summer complete at least three educational events or livestock activities and participate in a fairgrounds clean-up between August 1, 2024 and the entry deadline of the fair. The events should pertain to the four species that are eligible for the premium sale.

This may include

- Rolling Prairie livestock project meeting
- Club Tour
- Exhibit in a spring show
- Livestock judging contest
- YQCA program online or face-to-face
- Present a market livestock presentation at Club Day
- Participate in a livestock educational tour or event
- Write a story about your livestock project
- Do a Financial Analysis of your livestock project with a loan officer at a lending institution.

If you are not sure if an event will count ask Jenny prior to attending to get verification. Also, it is your responsibility to notify the office what events you attended and/or participated in order to receive credit for them. Local club events or project meetings are not the only activities that were meant to count toward the requirement. We want you to attend both in and out of district events for the requirements.

To sell in the premium sale, animals must be of a packer acceptable weight based on the scales at the fair. Animals may go across the scales two times, if under weight. Underweight animals maybe fed & watered under supervision but must reweigh in the time allotted. No drenching of animals. Superintendent has overall say in ethical treatment of animals. The minimum weight for each species is:

- Steers 1,050 pounds (8a-9a)
- Pigs 210 pounds (9a-10a)
- Lambs 90 pounds (10a-11a)
- Goats/Hair Sheep 50 pounds (10a-11a)

Fairgrounds Clean-Up Days

4-H Fairgrounds Clean Up Days are super important because they help us take care of our environment, show responsibility, and make our community a better place. When we clean up our fairgrounds, we're not just picking up trash; we're



also making our home safer and nicer for everyone. By working together, we show that we care about where we live and that we're proud members of our community—and proud members of 4-H. So, keep up the great work, 4-H'ers! Your efforts make a big difference!
